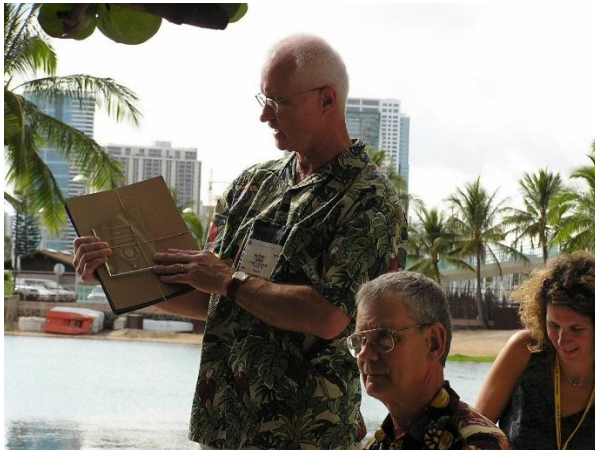
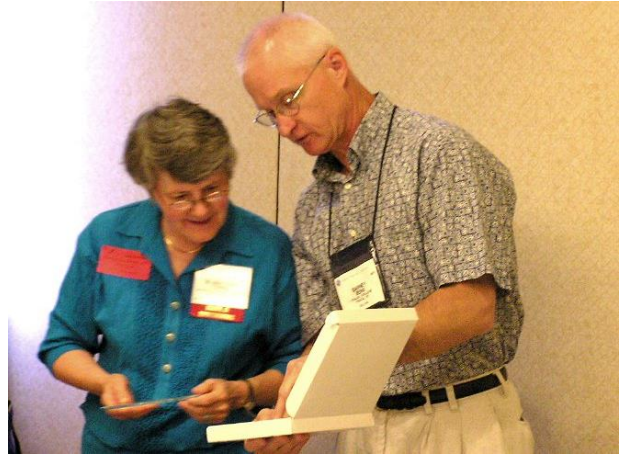
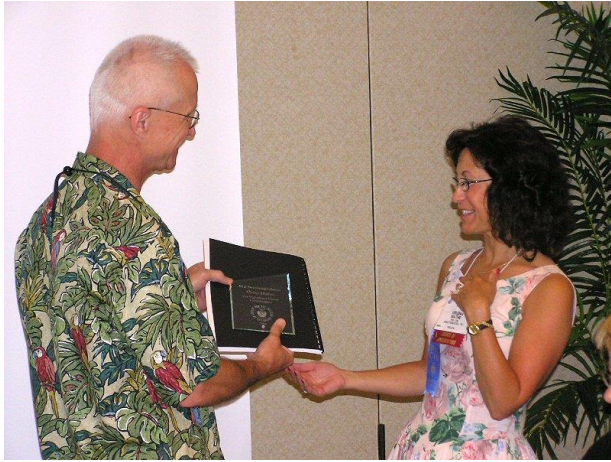

#### Wilbert J. McKeachie, PhD

For his extraordinary career, reflected in his enormous contributions to the teaching of psychology, our research base, and the direction and governance of the American Psychological Association as well as other psychological and higher education organizations. In more than 30 books and monographs, 120 chapters, 200 journal and professional articles, and 500 scientific and professional presentations and workshops, Dr. McKeachie has significantly contributed to the understanding of individual differences, human learning, and the psychology of teaching. In the 1970s, Dr. McKeachie created the first college-level teaching center which is now used as a model by many institutions in the United States and overseas. Dr. McKeachie served as president of the American Psychological Association and also held more than 25 other major positions. In addition, he was also the president of the division of educational, instructional, and school psychology for the International Association of Applied Psychology and the American Association for Higher Education. He has served on the board of directors for seven national organizations. For his contributions to psychology, Dr. McKeachie has earned more than 30 major awards, including the American Psychological Association's Centennial Award for Outstanding Contributions, the American Psychological Foundation's Gold Medal Award for Enduring Contributions to Psychology in the Public Interest and an American Psychological Association Gold Key Award. Dr. McKeachie's students and colleagues regard him not only for his record of contributions and accomplishments, but more importantly for his infectious passion for his work, his guidance, his warmth, and lifetime support as a mentor, his optimism, his joy, and his zest for life that make him an outstanding professor and psychologist.

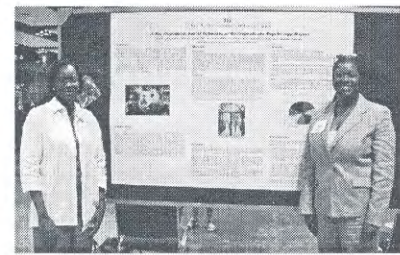

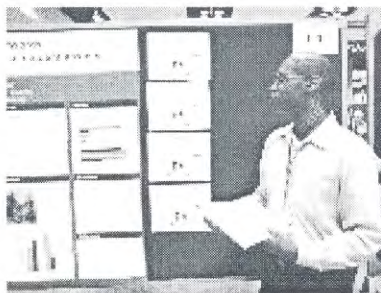
